

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW)

The Household Hazardous Waste Depot is located at Kaizer Meadow Solid Waste Facility, 450 Kaizer Meadow Road off Highway 14 (approximately 17 km north of Exit 8 toward Windsor). It is open to all residents of the Municipality of Chester during regular landfill hours which are Monday to Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm and Saturdays from 8:00 am to noon. The Scale House Operator will direct you.

PLEASE NOTE that the HHW site is for residential customers only. Please call 275-1312 or 275-2330 for disposal info for businesses.



WHAT CAN I TAKE TO THE HHW SITE?

Many products we use are hazardous and should not be thrown in the garbage. Below are some examples of household hazardous waste that we accept at the HHW Depot:

- Paint
- Herbicides and pesticides
- Propane tanks & cylinders
- Cleaners and degreasers
- Fertilizers, bleaches, stump removers
- Fluorescent lights, including compact fluorescent lights
- Used chain oil & transmission fluid
- Wood preservatives
- Batteries
- Solvents, varnish, stains, thinners



Leftover paint and batteries can also be taken to Adams Bottle Exchange & ENVIRO-DepotTM located at 5962 Highway #3 in Gold River.

Below are examples of what **CANNOT** be brought to our HHW Depot. Call Public Works at 275-1312 or Kaizer Meadow Solid Waste Facility at 275-2330 for alternative disposal.

- Business, industrial & institutional waste
- Bio-medical waste or pharmaceuticals
- Contaminated soil
- Excessive amounts of material
- Compressed gas cylinders (oxygen, acetylene, helium, etc.)
- PCB's, radioactives, explosives
- Asbestos
- Unidentified material
- Waste generated outside the Municipality

STORAGE OF HAZARDOUS WASTE: You can easily store your hazardous waste if you have extra room. Here are a few helpful tips:

- ▲ Always store household hazardous materials in sealed containers.
- ▲ **KEEP HAZARDOUS MATERIALS OUT OF THE REACH OF CHILDREN.**
- ▲ To keep paint fresh, store it upside down in a tightly sealed container.
- ▲ Reuse paint thinners by letting the solids settle and then pouring off the liquid into another proper container. Dispose the solids as hazardous waste.
- ▲ Please ensure that the materials going to the HHW site are in either their original container or a labelled container so that they can be easily and properly identified.
